# 2.1 About this Installation Manual

This document, the *AKD*<sup>®</sup>2*G* Installation Manual ("Instructions Manual" according to EC Machinery Directive 2006/42/EU), describes the AKD<sup>®</sup>2G series of digital drives and includes information needed to safely install an AKD2G.

This document is valid for AKD2G single axis drive or dual axis drive with 110 V to 240 V or 240 V to 480 V mains voltage.

- Programmability options: Base drive or Position Indexer drive
- Connectivity options: analog, CANopen, EtherCAT, PROFINET, EtherNet/IP

# 3.1 You should pay attention to this

This section helps to recognize risks and avoid dangers to people and objects.

## Specialist staff required!

The devices are intended for industrial applications. Machine builders must employ qualified personnel. Qualified personnel are people who have been trained to transport, install, commission and operate electrical drives.

- Transport, storage, unpacking: only by personnel with knowledge of handling electrostatically sensitive components.
- Mechanical installation: only by personnel with mechanical expertise.
- Electrical installation: only by personnel with expertise in electrical engineering.
- Basic tests / setup: only by personnel with expertise in electrical engineering and drive technology.

The qualified personnel must know and observe ISO 12100 / IEC 60364 / IEC 60664 and national accident prevention regulations.

## Read the documentation!

Read the available documentation before installation and commissioning. Improper handling of the devices can cause harm to people or damage to property. The operator of systems using the drive system must ensure that all personnel who work with the drive read and understand the manual before using the drive.

## **Check Hardware Revision!**

Check the Hardware Revision Number of the product (see product label). This number is the link between your product and the manual. The product Hardware Revision Number must match the Hardware Revision Number on the cover page of the manual.

## Pay attention to the technical data!

Adhere to the technical data and the specifications on connection conditions. If permissible voltage values or current values are exceeded, the devices can be damaged. Unsuitable motor or wrong wiring will damage the system components. Check the combination of drive and motor. Compare the rated voltage and current of the units.

#### Perform a risk assessment!

The manufacturer of the machine must generate a risk assessment for the machine, and take appropriate measures to ensure that unforeseen movements cannot cause injury or damage to any person or property. Additional requirements on specialist staff may also result from the risk assessment.

#### Automatic restart



The drive might restart automatically after power on, voltage dip or interruption of the supply voltage, depending on the parameter setting. Risk of death or serious injury for humans working in the machine.

If the parameter AXIS#.ENDEFAULT is set to 1, then place a warning sign to the machine (Warning: Automatic Restart at Power On) and ensure, that power on is not possible, while humans are in a dangerous zone of the machine. In case of using an undervoltage protection device, you must observe EN 60204-1:2006 chapter 7.5.

**ATTENTION**: The drive is ready to operate with pre-configured STO function.

## **Observe electrostatically sensitive components!**

The devices contain electrostatically sensitive components which may be damaged by incorrect handling. Electrostatically discharge your body before touching the device. Avoid contact with highly insulating materials (artificial fabrics, plastic film etc.). Place the device on a conductive surface.

## Hot surface!



Drives may have hot surfaces during operation. The housing can reach temperatures above 80°C. Risk of minor burns! Measure the temperature, and wait until the housing has cooled down below 40 °C before touching it.

## Earthing!

It is vital that you ensure that the drive is safely earthed to the PE (protective earth) busbar in the switch cabinet. Risk of electric shock. Without low-resistance earthing no personal protection can be guaranteed.

## Leakage Current!

Since the leakage current to PE is more than 3.5 mA, in compliance with IEC61800-5-1 the PE connection must either be doubled or a connecting cable with a cross-section >10 mm<sup>2</sup> must be used. Deviating measures according to regional standards might be possible.

## High voltages!



The equipment produces high electric voltages up to 900 V. Lethal danger exists at live parts of the device. Do not open or touch the equipment during operation. Keep all covers and cabinet doors closed. Built-in protection measures such as insulation or shielding may not be removed. Work on the electrical installation may only be performed by trained and qualified personnel, in compliance with the regulations for safety at work, and only with switched off mains supply, and secured against restart.

Never undo any electrical connections to the drive while it is live. There is a danger of electrical arcing with damage to contacts and personal injury. Wait at least 5 minutes after disconnecting the drive from the main supply power before touching potentially live sections of the equipment (such as contacts) or removing any connections.

Always measure the voltage in the DC bus link and wait until the voltage is below 50 V before handling components.

## **Functional Safety!**

The assessment of the safety functions according to EN13849 or EN 62061 must finally be done by the user.

## **Reinforced Insulation**

Thermal sensors, motor holding brakes and feedback systems built into the connected motor must have reinforced insulation (according to IEC61800-5-1) against system components with power voltage, according to the required application test voltage. All Koll-morgen components meet these requirements.

## Never modify the drive!

It is not allowed to modify the drive hardware without permission by the manufacturer. Opening the housing causes loss of warranty.

# 3.2 Use as Directed

The AKD2G drives are exclusively intended for driving suitable synchronous servomotors with closed-loop control of torque, speed, and/or position.

AKD2G are components that are built into electrical plants or machines and can only be operated as integral components of these plants or machines. The manufacturer of the machine used with a drive must generate a risk assessment for the machine. When the drives are built into machines or plant, the drive must not be used until it has been established that the machine or plant fulfills the requirements of the regional directives.

#### **Cabinet and wiring**

Drives must only be operated in a closed control cabinet suitable for the ambient conditions ( $\rightarrow$  # 40). Ventilation or cooling may be necessary to keep the temperature within the cabinet below 40 °C or 60 °C if using extended range operation with derating.

Use only copper conductors for wiring. The conductor cross-sections can be derived from the standard IEC 60204 (alternatively for AWG cross-sections: NEC Table 310-16, 75 °C column).

#### **Power supply**

The drives can be supplied by 1, 2 or 3 phase (TN-S or TT) or DC industrial supply networks.

Drives in the AKD2G series can be supplied as follows:

AKD2G-Sxx-6Vxx:

1, 2 or 3 phase industrial supply networks (not more than 10 kA symmetrical rated current at 120 V and 240 V) or DC supply.

AKD2G-Sxx-7Vxx:

3 phase industrial supply networks (not more than 10 kA symmetrical rated current at 240 V, 400 V and 480 V) or DC supply.

Connection to other voltage types of supply networks is possible with an additional isolating transformer.

Repeated overvoltages between phases (L1, L2, L3) and the housing of the drive must not exceed 1000 V peak. In accordance with IEC 61800, voltage spikes (< 50  $\mu$ s) between phases must not exceed 1000 V. Voltage spikes (< 50  $\mu$ s) between a phase and the housing must not exceed 2000 V.

#### Motor voltage rating

The rated voltage of the motors must be at least as high as the DC bus link voltage divided by  $\sqrt{2}$  produced by the drive (U<sub>nMotor</sub>>=U<sub>DC</sub>/ $\sqrt{2}$ ).

## **Functional Safety**

- environments with corrosive and/or electrically conductive acids, alkaline solutions, oils, vapors, dusts
- ships or offshore applications

The drive must not be connected directly to the Internet. If the network, to which the drive is connected, is not secured according to state-of-the-art information technology, this could be a functional safety risk.

# 3.5 Shock-hazard Protection

#### 3.5.1 Leakage current

Leakage current via the PE conductor results from the combination of equipment and cable leakage currents. The leakage current frequency pattern includes a number of frequencies, whereby the residual-current circuit breakers definitively evaluate the 50 Hz current. For this reason, the leakage current cannot be measured using a conventional multimeter. Contact our application department for help to calculate the leakage current in your application.

## NOTE

Since the leakage current to PE is more than 3.5 mA, in compliance with IEC61800-5-1 the PE connection must either be doubled or a connecting cable with a cross-section >10 mm<sup>2</sup> must be used. Use the PE terminal and the PE connection screws in order to fulfill this requirement.

The following measures can be used to minimize leakage currents:

- Reduce the length of the engine cable.
- Use low capacitance motor cables (→ # 59).

## 3.5.2 Residual current protective device (RCD)

In conformity with IEC 60364-4-41 – Regulations for installation and IEC 60204 – Electrical equipment of machinery, residual current protective devices (RCDs) can be used provided the requisite regulations are complied with. The AKD2G is a 3-phase system with a B6 bridge. Therefore, RCDs which are sensitive to all currents must be used in order to detect any DC fault current.

Rated residual currents in the RCDs:

10 to 30 mA	Protection against "indirect contact" (personal fire protection) for sta- tionary and mobile equipment, as well as for "direct contact".	
<b>50 to 300 mA</b> Protection against "indirect contact" (personal fire protection) for stationary equipment		

#### NOTE

Recommendation: In order to protect against direct contact (with motor cables shorter than 5 m) Kollmorgen recommends that each drive be protected individually using a 30 mA RCD which is sensitive to all currents.

If you use a selective RCD, the more intelligent evaluation process will prevent spurious tripping of the RCD.

#### 3.5.3 Isolating transformers

When protection against indirect contact is absolutely essential despite a higher leakage current, or when an alternative form of shock-hazard protection is sought, the AKD2G can also be operated by using an isolating transformer. A ground-leakage monitor can be used to monitor for short circuits.

**NOTE** Keep the length of wiring between the transformer and the drive as short as possible.

# 3.6 Stop / Emergency Stop / Emergency Off

The control functions Stop, Emergency Stop and Emergency Off are defined by IEC 60204. Notes for functional safety aspects of these functions can be found in ISO 13849 and IEC 62061.

The parameter AXIS#.DISMODE must be set to implement the different stop categories

for software disabling. Consult the WorkBench Online Help for configuring the parameter.





# WARNING Vertical load could fall!

Serious injury could result when the load is not properly blocked. The internal brake function does not ensure functional safety.

- Functional Safety can be ensured with configured SBC ( $\rightarrow$  # 201) only.
- For SIL 3 a second (external) motor brake for an axis is required. For single axis drives this brake can be connected to X4 (→ # 101). For dual axis drives the additional brake must be controlled from another source (e.g. from the other axis or externally from a safety controller). The brakes can be mapped to an axis with WorkBench.
- The Hardware Enable does not initiate a controlled stop but switches off the power stage immediately.
- Set parameter AXIS#.MOTOR.BRAKEIMM to 1 with vertical axes, to apply the brake immediately after faults or Hardware Disable.
- Risk assessment of the application determines the necessary measures.

# 3.6.1 Stop

The stop function shuts down the machine in normal operation. The stop function is defined by IEC 60204.

NOTE

The Stop Category must be determined by a risk evaluation of the machine.

Stop function must have priority over assigned start functions. The following stop categories are defined:

# Stop Category 0

Shut-down by immediate switching-off the energy supply to the drive machinery (this is an uncontrolled shut-down).

For stop without using safety functions like STO, set AXIS#.DISMODE to 0. The safety function STO stops the drive as required by Stop Category 0 (IEC 62061).

## **Stop Category 1**

A controlled shut-down, whereby the energy supply to the drive machinery is maintained to perform the shut-down, and the energy supply is only interrupted when the shut-down has been completed.

For stop without using safety functions like SS1, set AXIS#.DISMODE to 2. The safety function SS1 stops the drive as required by Stop Category 1 (IEC 62061).

## Stop Category 2

A controlled shut-down, whereby the energy supply to the drive machinery is maintained. This category shall be realized with a safety function like SS2. Safety function SS2 stops the drive as required by Stop Category 2 (IEC 62061).

Stop Category 0 and Stop Category 1 stops must be operable independently of the operating mode, whereby a Category 0 stop must have priority.

If necessary, provision must be made for the connection of protective devices and lockouts. If applicable, the stop function must signal its status to the control logic. A reset of the stop function must not create a hazardous situation.

## 3.6.2 Emergency Stop

The Emergency Stop function is used for the fastest possible shutdown of the machine in a dangerous situation. The Emergency Stop function is defined by IEC 60204. Principles of emergency stop devices and functional aspects are defined in ISO 13850.

The Emergency Stop function will be triggered by the manual actions of a single person. It must be fully functional and available at all times. The user must understand instantly how to operate this mechanism (without consulting references or instructions).

NOTE

The Stop Category for the Emergency Stop must be determined by a risk evaluation of the machine.

In addition to the requirements for stop, the Emergency Stop must fulfill the following requirements:

- Emergency Stop must have priority over all other functions and controls in all operating modes.
- The energy supply to any drive machinery that could cause dangerous situations must be switched off as fast as possible, without causing any further hazards (Stop Category 0) or must be controlled in such a way, that any movement that causes danger, is stopped as fast as possible (Stop Category 1).
- The reset must not initiate a restart.

#### 3.6.3 Emergency Off

The Emergency Off function is used to switch-off the electrical power supply of the machine. This is done to prevent users from any risk from electrical energy (for example electrical impact). Functional aspects for Emergency Off are defined in IEC 60364-5-53.

The Emergency Off function will be triggered by the manual actions of a single person.

NOTE

The result of a risk evaluation of the machine determines the necessity for an Emergency Off function.

Emergency Off is done by switching off the supply energy by electro-mechanical switching devices. This results in a category 0 stop. If this stop category is not possible in the application, then the Emergency Off function must be replaced by other measures (for example by protection against direct touching).

## 4.1 Transport

Transport the AKD2G in accordance with IEC 61800-2 as follows:

- Transport only by qualified personnel in the manufacturer's original recyclable packaging.
- NOTICE: Avoid shocks while transporting.
- Vibration/Shock: AKD2G is tested for environmental class 2M1 of IEC 60721-3-2.
- Store at or below maximum stacking height 8 cartons (see "Storage" (→ # 31))
- Transport only within specified temperature ranges:
- -25 to +70 °C, max. rate of change 20 K/hour, class 2K3.
- Transport only within specified humidity: max. 95% relative humidity at +40°C, no condensation, class 2K3.

## NOTICE

The drives contain electrostatically sensitive components that can be damaged by incorrect handling. Electrostatically discharge yourself before touching the drive. Avoid contact with highly insulating materials, such as artificial fabrics and plastic films. Place the drive on a conductive surface.

If the packaging is damaged, check the unit for visible damage. Inform the shipper and the manufacturer of any damage to the package or product.

## 4.3 Storage

Store the AKD2G in accordance with IEC 61800-2 as follows:

- Store only in the manufacturer's original recyclable packaging.
- Store at or below maximum stacking height 8 cartons.
- Store only within specified temperature ranges: -25 to +55 °C, max.rate of change 20 K/hour, class 1K4.
- Storage only within specified humidity: 5 to 95% relative humidity, no condensation, class 1K3.
- Store in accordance with the following duration requirements:
  - Less than 1 year: without restriction.
  - More than 1 year: capacitors must be re-formed before setting up and operating the drive. Re-forming procedures are described in the KDN (Forming).

# 4.4 Installation, setup and normal operation

Installation and setup information are given in this manual:

- Mechanical installation ( $\rightarrow$  # 52)
- Electrical installation (→ # 55)
- Setup (→ # 136)

Normal operation tested for environmental class 3K3 according to IEC 61800-2 ( $\rightarrow$  # 40). The manufacturer of the machine defines the necessary end user expertise based on the risk assessment for the machine and describes the requirements for normal operation based on the application.

## 4.5 Decommissioning

## 4.6 Maintenance and cleaning

The device does not require maintenance, it should be inspected once a year by professional staff.

**NOTICE** Do not immerse or spray the device. Avoid that liquid enters the device. The inside of the unit can only be cleaned by the manufacturer. Opening the device voids the warranty.

To clean the device exterior:

- 1. Decommission the device (see chapter 4.5 "Decommissioning").
- 2. Casing: Clean with Isopropanol or similar cleaning solution.

Caution : Highly Flammable! Risk of injury by explosion and fire.

- Observe the safety notes given on the cleaning liquid package.
- Wait at least 30 minutes after cleaning before putting the device back into operation.
- 3. Protective grill on fan: Clean with a dry brush.

## 4.7 Disassembly

- 3. Check all connections for correct fastening.
- 4. Setup the system as described in the Installation Manual.





## 6.6 Electrical Motor Braking

## 6.6.1 Drive Dynamic Braking

Drive Dynamic braking is a method to slow down a servo system by dissipating the mechanical energy driven by the motor back EMF.

### NOTE

Drive dynamic braking is not functional safe. Safe dynamic braking (SDB) requires an external SDB module ( $\rightarrow$  # 216).

The AKD2G has a built in advanced drive dynamic braking mode which operates fully in hardware. When activated, the drive powers the motor terminals with voltages to maximize the stopping force per amount of motor current. This advanced method forces all of the dynamic braking current to be stopping current and insures the fastest stopping per ampere of motor terminal current.

- When current is not being limited, the mechanical energy is being dissipated in the motor winding resistance.
- When current is being limited, energy is returned to the drive bus capacitors.
- The drive also limits the maximum dynamic braking motor terminal current by using the AXIS#.DBILIMIT parameter to insure that the drive, motor, and customer load do not see excessive currents/forces.

Whether and how the AKD2G uses dynamic drive braking depends on (AXIS#.DISMODE).

### 6.6.2 Regeneration breaking

When the amount of returned energy from the motor builds the bus capacitor voltage up enough the drive activates the regenerative braking circuit to start dumping the returned energy in the regen resistor (also called regenerative resistor or brake resistor). All AKD2G offer internal resistor plus the ability to connect an external resistor depending on the application requirements.

External regen resistors are described in the regional Accessories Manual.

### 6.6.2.1 Functional description

NOTE

### 1. Individual drives, not coupled through the DC bus link circuit (+DC, -DC)

When the energy fed back from the motor has an average or peak power that exceeds the preset level for the brake power rating, the drive generates the warning "W2010 Regen Energy Critical". If the power exceeds the set fault level, the regenerative circuit will switch off and the drive will disable.

### 2. Several drives coupled through the DC bus link (+DC, -DC)

Using the built-in regenerative circuit, several drives of the same series can be operated from a common DC-bus link ( $\rightarrow$  # 90), without any additional measures. 90% of the combined power of all the coupled drives is always available for peak and continuous power. If the power of the drive with the lowest switch-off threshold (resulting from tolerances) exceeds the set fault level, the regenerative circuit will switch off on that drive.

**Switch-off on over voltage**: With the regenerative circuit switched off, the returned energy is not dissipated and therefore the DC-bus link level increases. The drive reports an over-voltage fault if the DC-bus voltage threshold is exceeded. When this happens, the drive power stage is immediately disabled and the load coasts to a stop with the fault message "F2006 Bus Over voltage".

The ready to operate contact (terminals X21/B5-B6) is opened ( $\rightarrow$  # 135).

#### NOTE

Observe the regeneration time (some minutes) after full load with peak brake power.



## 6.7 LCD Display and Push-buttons (B1, B2)

The drive offers an LCD display and two push-buttons B1 / B2 for navigation.



### **Push-button actions**

A short button press invokes the action corresponding to the symbol directly above the button. On the dashboard for example,

- a short press on B1 causes the menu system to appear, and
- a short press on B2 causes a help screen to appear.
- A long press (greater than 2 seconds) on B2 returns the display to the previous screen.



# CAUTION High EMC Voltage Level!

Risk of electrical shock, if the servo amplifier (or the motor) is not properly EMC-grounded.

- Use electrically conductive mounting plates, e. g. made of aluminum or galvanized steel.
- In unfavourable circumstances, use copper mesh tape between the earthing bolts and earth potential to deflect currents.

#### NOTICE

Protect the drive from impermissible stresses. In particular, do not let any components become bent or any insulation distances altered during transport and handling. Avoid contact with electronic components and contacts.

## 7.2 Guide to Mechanical Installation

You need at least the following tools to install the AKD2G:

- M5 hexagon socket-cap screws (ISO 4762)
- 4 mm hexagon ball head screwdriver
- No. 2 Phillips head screwdriver
- Small slotted screwdriver

Your specific installation may require additional tools.

**NOTICE** Do not mount the drive right next to devices that produce magnetic fields. Strong magnetic fields can directly affect internal components. Install the drive with distance to such devices and/or shield the magnetic fields.

Install the drive unit as follows:


- Mount the drive in a closed control cabinet (ambient conditions (→ # 40). The site must be free from conductive or corrosive materials. For the mounting position in the cabinet see (→ # 54).
- Check that the ventilation of the drive is unimpeded and keep within the permitted ambient temperature (→ # 40). Keep the required space clearance above and below the drive (→ # 54).
- Ensure that there is an adequate flow of cool, filtered air into the bottom of the control cabinet, or use a heat exchanger (→ # 40).
  - Notice: The drive will switch itself off in case of overheating.
- 4. If you are using a cooling system for the control cabinet, position the cooling system in a way that condensation water cannot drip onto the drive or peripheral devices.
- 5. Assemble the drive and power supply next to each other on the conductive, grounded mounting plate in the cabinet.
- 6. Ground the mounting plate, motor housing and CNC-GND of the control system. For EMC-compliant shielding and grounding see (→ # 62).



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Only professional staff who are qualified in electrical engineering are allowed to install the drive. Wires with color green with one or more yellow stripes must not be used other than for protective earth (PE) wiring.



# DANGER High Voltage up to 900 V!

Wrong mains voltage, unsuitable motor or wrong wiring will damage the drive. Check the combination of drive and motor. Compare the rated voltage and current of the units. Implement the wiring according to the matching connection diagram, see ( $\rightarrow$  #71) and following.

Make sure that the maximum permissible rated voltage at the terminals L1, L2, L3 or +DC, -DC is not exceeded by more than 10% even in the most unfavorable circumstances (see IEC 60204-1).

Excessively high external fusing will endanger cables and devices. The fusing of the mains power and logic power must be installed by the user. Hints for use of Residual-current circuit breakers (RCD) ( $\rightarrow$  # 27).

Since the leakage current to PE is more than 3.5 mA, in compliance with IEC61800-5-1 the PE connection must either be doubled or a connecting cable with a cross-section >10 mm<sup>2</sup> must be used. Deviating measures according to regional standards might be possible.

The drive status shall be monitored by the PLC to acknowledge critical situations. We recommend wiring the ready to operate relay contact in series into the emergency off circuit of the installation. The emergency off circuit must operate the supply contactor.

It is permissible to use WorkBench to change the settings of the drive. Any other alteration will invalidate the warranty.

Kollmorgen recommends to install the drive electrical system as follows:

- 1. Select cables in accordance with IEC 60204 ( $\rightarrow$  # 59).
- Install shielding and ground the drive.
   For EMC-compliant shielding and grounding, see (→ # 62).
   Ground the mounting plate, motor housing and CNC-GND of the control system.
- 3. For functional safety information, see ( $\rightarrow$  # 154).
- Wire the drive and connectors.
   Observe the "Recommendations for EMI noise reduction": (→ # 62).
  - Wire the "Ready to Operate" contact into the emergency off circuit of the system.
  - Connect the digital control inputs and outputs.
  - Connect up analog ground (also if a fieldbus is used).
  - Connect the analog input source, if required.
  - Connect the motor (hybrid cable or power, brake and feedback cables).
  - Connect shielding at both ends.
  - If required, connect the external regen resistor (with fusing).
  - Connect the mains filter FN2090/FN3288 with AKD2G-Sxx-6V (with shielded lines between filter and drive) for second environment requirements to product category C2.
  - Connect the auxiliary voltage supply
  - Connect the main electrical supply.
     Check maximum permitted voltage value (→ # 42).
  - Check proper use of residual-current circuit breakers (RCD): ( $\rightarrow$  #27).
  - Connect the PC ( $\rightarrow$  # 122) for setting up the drive.

## 8.3 Wiring

## NOTICE

Only professional staff who are qualified in electrical engineering are allowed to install the drive. Wires with color green with one or more yellow stripes must not be used other than for protective earth (PE) wiring. When installing or replacing cables, use only standardized components, which comply to the cable and wire requirements ( $\rightarrow$  # 59).

## 8.3.1 General



## **DANGER** High Voltage up to 900 V!

There is a danger of serious personal injury or death by electrical shock or electrical arcing.

- Only install and wire the equipment when it is not live, that is, when neither the electrical supply nor the 24 V auxiliary voltage nor the supply voltages of any other connected equipment is switched on.
- Make sure that the cabinet is safely disconnected (for instance, with a lock-out and warning signs). The individual voltages are switched on for the first time during setup.

NOTE

NOTE

The chassis ground symbol, which is used in all the wiring diagrams, indicates that you must take care to provide an electrically conductive connection with the largest feasible surface area between the unit indicated and the mounting plate in the control cabinet. This connection is for the effective grounding of HF interference, and must not be confused with the PE-symbol (PE = protective earth, safety measure as per IEC 60204).

To reach the maximum permitted cable length, you must use cable material with the following capacitance requirements:

- Motor power cable: less than 150 pF/m (phase core to shield capacitance)
- Motor Feedback cable: less than 120 pF/m (signal core to shield capacitance)
- Hybrid motor cable:
  - less than 120 pF/m (phase core/core capacitance)
  - less than 210 pF/m (phase core/shield capacitance)
  - less than 120 pF/m (signal core/core capacitance)
  - less than 210 pF/m (signal core/shield capacitance)
  - BUS Element: 45 pF/m @ 800kHz & charact. wave resistance  $110\pm10\Omega$  @ 10MHz

#### 8.3.3.2 Cable length

Cables should not exceed the maximum lengths stated below. The recommended maximum cable length of motor cables depends on the used cable material and the feedback type. Cable functionality is only guaranteed up to the maximum length when using unmodified Kollmorgen engineered cables.

### 8.3.3.3 T-Connector wiring

If you use mating T-connectors for 24 VDC supply, mains voltage supply and DC-Bus link, you must prepare the connecting cables with wire end ferrules.

You can prepare cables with cross-section 2.5 mm<sup>2</sup> (up to to 6 mm<sup>2</sup>) with a uniform length of 170 mm, if the modules are lined up close together.

Use wire end ferrules with plastic collars, for example 2.5 mm<sup>2</sup> x 17 mm.


## 8.3.4 Protective Earth Connection

Protective Earth connection of the system components is a safety measure per IEC 60204. Ensure the proper grounding of all components with the PE rail in the control cabinet as reference potential. Connect each ground individually with the intended grounding cable (neutral point connection).

The leakage current from AKD2G against PE is more than 3.5 mA. In accordance with EN 61800-5-1, the PE connection must therefore either be double implemented or a connection cable with >10mm<sup>2</sup> cross-section used.

In order to keep the impedance as low as possible, we recommend a copper earthing strap for the PE connection on the PE block.

Wire the PE connections immediately after installing the devices as the first electrical connection. Now you insert all the other lines and connectors. For disassembly, release the PE connections as the last connection.

For the use of residual current protective devices (RCD), refer to ( $\rightarrow$  #27).

## 8.4 EMI Noise Reduction



## **CAUTION** Electromagnetic Fields!

Electromagnetic radiation may lead to potential hazardous danger (warming, failure of implants), when acting on electrically conductive materials.

- Work on the electrical installation may only be performed by trained and qualified personnel, in compliance with the regulations for safety at work, and only with switched off mains supply and secured against restart.
- Do not remove grounding, equipotential bonding and radiation-reducing shields.

### 8.4.1 Reducing EMI noise

With the help of the following instructions, you can reduce electrical interference in the application:


- Ensure good connections between the cabinet components. Connect the back panel and cabinet door to the cabinet body using several conductive braids. Never rely on hinges or mounting bolts for ground connections.
- Ensure good ground connection. Connect from cabinet to proper earth ground. Ground leads should be the same gauge as the leads to main power, but must cover the regional legal requirements, example (→ # 61).
- **Use Kollmorgen cables.** Route power and control cables separately, Kollmorgen recommends a distance of at least 200 mm to improve interference immunity.
- **Ground the shielding at both ends.** Ground all shielding with large areas (low impedance), with metalized connector housings or shield connection clamps wherever possible. For cables entering a cabinet, connect shields on all 360° of the cable. Never connect a simple "pigtail." For more information on shielding concepts, ( $\rightarrow \# 63$ ).
- With separate mains filter, maintain separation of leads entering and exiting the mains filter (line power filter). Locate the filter as close as possible to the point where the incoming power enters the cabinet. If it is necessary for input power and motor leads to cross, cross them at 90°.
- **Observe cable length limits.** Maximum distance for unshielded I/O lines is 3 m inside the cabinet. If the I/O cable leaves the cabinet, it must be EMC shielded.
- Feedback lines and Hybrid Cables may not be extended, since the shielding would be interrupted and the signal processing may be disturbed.Install all feedback cables with an adequate cross-section, per IEC 60204 (→ # 59) and use the requested cable material to reach maximum cable length.
- Splice cables properly. If you need to divide cables, use connectors with metal backshells. Ensure that both shells connect along the full 360° of the shields.
- Use differential inputs for analog signals. Noise susceptibility in analog signals is greatly reduced by using differential inputs. Use twisted-pair, shielded signal lines, connecting shields on both ends.
- Cables between drives and filters or external regen resistors must be shielded. Install all power cables with an adequate cross-section per IEC 60204 (→ # 59) and use the requested cable material to reach maximum cable length.

## 8.4.2 Shielding with external shielding busbar

For best practice use of shielded cables Kollmorgen recommends a star point shield connection, for example, with a shielding busbar.

### 8.4.2.1 Shielding Concept

Example with AKD2G-Sxx--6Vxx, EMC filter and external regen resistor.




### 8.4.2.2 Shielding Busbar



The power cable shields (line in, motor cable, external regen resistor) can be routed to an additional busbar via shield clamps.

Kollmorgen recommends using Weidmüller KLBÜ shield clamps.

A possible scenario for setting up a busbar for the above shield clamps is described below.



1. Cut a busbar of the required length from a brass rail (crosssection  $10 \times 3$  mm) and drill holes in it as indicated. All shield clamps required must fit between the drill holes.



2. Squeeze together the coil spring and the supporting plate and push the busbar through the opening in the holder.

3. Mount the busbar with the shield clamps fitted on the assembly plate. Use either metal spacer bushes or screws with nuts and accessories to maintain a spacing of 50 mm. Earth the busbar using a single conductor with a cross-section of at least 2.5 mm<sup>2</sup>.

4. Strip the external cable sheath to a length of approx. 30 mm, taking care not to damage the braided shield. Push the shield clamp up and route the cable to it via the busbar.






Use shield connection clamps (see accessories manual). These hook into the grounding plate and ensure optimum contact between the shield and the grounding plate.

Kollmorgen recommends using Phoenix Contact SK14 shield clamps with cable clamp range of 6-13mm.

### 8.4.3.3 Motor connector X1/X2 with shielding connection

Alternative connection of the motor power by mating connector with shield plate and strain relief. Kollmorgen motor power and hybrid motor cables are configured with shield plate. To connect the motor power, proceed as follows:



- 1. Strip the external cable sheath to a length of approx. 80mm, taking care not to damage the braided shield.
- 2. Push the braided shield (1) back over the cable and secure with a rubber sleeve (2) or shrink sleeve.
- Shorten all the wires apart from the protective earth (PE) wire (green/yellow) by about 20mm so that the PE wire is now the longest wire.
- 4. Strip all wires and fit wire end ferrules.
- 5. Secure the braided shield of the cable with metal cable ties (3) and fasten the cable.
- 6. Wire the connector as shown in the connection diagram.
- 7. Plug in the connector to the socket on the front of the AKD2G and secure it with the red clip.



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









8.5.5 Wiring overview, single axis drive





## 8.7 DC Bus link connector X3

The DC bus link can be connected in parallel so that the power returned from slowing down motors is divided between all the drives that are connected to the same DC bus link circuit. Every drive must have its own power connection to mains voltage sharing the same branch, over current protection devices, even if the DC bus link is used. Drives working generatively very often should be placed beside drives, which need energy. That reduces current flow on longer distances.

NOTE

The sum of the rated currents for all drives connected in parallel to an AKD2G must not exceed 48 A.

Examples:12S-12S-12D-12D-12D or 06D-12S-12D-06D-06D-03S-03S-03S Wiring: Use 6 mm<sup>2</sup> unshielded single cores with a max. length of 200 mm; use 6 mm<sup>2</sup> shielded cables for longer lengths. In this case no fuse for line protection is required.

NOTICE

The drives can be destroyed if DC bus link voltages are different. Only drives with mains supply that share the same AC branch, over current protection devices (identical mains supply voltage) may have the DC bus links interconnected.

Interconnection of DC bus links works best in systems powered by 3-phase AC or DC power. Consult Kollmorgen for DC bus linking with single phase AC power input.








Without DC Bus fuses, other devices can become damaged or destroyed if, for example, a device fails due to an internal short circuit. If multiple drives are connected in parallel, then it is usual to insert DC Bus fuses (Fgroup) between groups of drives (with a group consisting of two or three devices, depending on the current) in order to limit any possible resulting damage. Fgroup fuses cannot avoid damage by current peaks completely.



## 8.7.3 Wiring example with busbar

If a device fails in this system due to a short-circuit, only its fuses (Fbus) are tripped and the rest of the network continues uninterrupted. The solid busbars can conduct significantly larger currents than T connectors, because the compensating current does not flow through the connector as above.



# 8.9 Motor Power, Brake and Feedback connection

The AKD2G drive is able to protect the connected motor from overloading, if the parameters are set correctly and the thermal protection sensor is connected and supervised. With Kollmorgen motors the valid data are automatically set by the WorkBench motor database. Refer to parameter AXIS#.MOTOR.RTYPE for supported thermal sensors.

The dynamic voltage rise can lead to a reduction in the motor operating life and, on unsuitable motors, to flashovers in the motor winding.

- Only install motors with insulation class F (acc. to IEC60085) or above.
- Only install cables that meet the requirements ( $\rightarrow$  # 59).

## 8.9.4 Motor Holding Brake Connection

A 24 V holding brake in the motor can be controlled directly by the drive. For proper function, check voltage drop, measure voltage at brake input and check brake function (on and off).

Brake voltage supply by using 24 V  $\pm$ 10% auxiliary voltage supply of the drive on X10. Minimum and maximum brake current see Electrical Data ( $\rightarrow$  #43) respectively ( $\rightarrow$  #45).



For dual axis drives the additional brake must be controlled from another source (e.g. from the other axis or externally from a safety controller). The brakes can be mapped to an axis with WorkBench.






The drive speed setpoint is internally driven down an adjustable ramp (AXIS#.CS.DEC) to 0 V.

With default values the output for the brake is switched on when the speed has reached 5 rpm (AXIS#.ZEROV) for at least 6 ms (AXIS#.ZEROT). The rise  $(t_{brH})$  and fall  $(t_{brL})$  times of the holding brake that is built into the motor are different for the various types of motor.

AKD2G offers up to five feedback channels which can serve

- to commutate the motor (single cable ( $\rightarrow$  # 93) or dual cable ( $\rightarrow$  # 99)),
- to close the velocity and/or position loops,
- to act as a command source (electronic gearing, flying sheer, master-slave (→ # 112)),

The usage of the five channels may be freely configured in software, subject only to a few restrictions that are not physically sensible.

- Exactly one feedback channel per axis can commutate the motor.
- At most one feedback channel per axis can serve as the command source and the same feedback channel cannot also commutate the motor.
- A feedback channel can serve as the command source for more than one axis.
- FB1 cannot commutate axis 2. FB2 cannot commutate axis 1.

## 8.11.2 Input - Electronic Gearing

AKD2G offers up to 5 feedback channels. Any of these channels may be used as the gearing command source. The gearing source is selected for each axis using AXIS#.GEAR.FBSOURCE. Refer to the WorkBench Online Help<u>(Electronic Gearing)</u> for more information.

## 8.11.3 Output - Emulated Encoder Output (EEO)

The drive calculates the motor shaft position from the cyclic- absolute signals of the commutation feedback, generating incremental-encoder compatible pulses or CW/CCW signals or Pulse/Direction signals from this information.

The resolution and the index (zero) position can be set in WorkBench. The outputs are driven from an internal supply voltage. Refer to the WorkBench Online Help for more information.





An optional termination plug is available for AKD2G (*AKD-CAN-TERMINATION*). The optional termination plug is an RJ25 connector with an enclosed wire jumper between pins 1&6. The termination plug should be inserted into the X13 connector of the last drive in the CAN network.







The drive provides 8 digital inputs on X21. Dual axis drives and drives with built-in option IO or DX offer additional 4 inputs on X22 and 2 programmable Input/Outputs on X22. If X23 is built-in and not used for feedback or EEO function, then it offers 4 additional programmable Input/Outputs.

Maximum distance for unshielded I/O lines is 3 m inside the cabinet. If the I/O cable leaves the cabinet, it must be EMC shielded.

Depending on the selected function, the inputs are high or low active. Digital input filter can be set in WorkBench to change sensitivity of the inputs (see Online Help).

## 9.1 Important Notes

#### NOTICE

Only professional personnel with extensive knowledge in the fields of electrical engineering and drive technology are allowed to test and set up the drive.



# **DANGER** Lethal Voltage!

There is a danger of serious personal injury or death by electrical shock. Lethal danger exists at live parts of the device.

- Built-in protection measures such as insulation or shielding may not be removed.
- Work on the electrical installation may only be performed by trained and qualified personnel, in compliance with the regulations for safety at work, and only with switched off mains supply, and secured against restart.
- In normal operation, the cabinet door must be closed and the device must not be touched.



## **WARNING** Automatic Restart!

Risk of death or serious injury for humans working in the machine. The drive might restart automatically after power on, voltage dip or interruption of the supply voltage, depending on the parameter setting. If parameter AXIS#.ENDEFAULT is set to 1,

- then place a warning sign ("WARNING: Possible Automatic Restart" or similar) to the machine.
- Ensure, that power on is not possible, while humans are in a dangerous zone of the machine.



# **CAUTION** High Temperature!

Risk of minor burns. The heat sink of the drive can reach temperatures up to 80°C in operation.

- Check the heat sink temperature before handling the drive.
- Wait until the heat sink has cooled down to 40°C before touching it.

- If the drive has been stored for more than 1 year, you must re-form the capacitors in the DC bus link circuit. Re-forming procedures are described in the KDN (<u>Forming</u>).


#### 9.2.1.1 Unpacking, mounting, and wiring the AKD2G

- 1. Unpack the drive and accessories.
- 2. Mount the drive.
- 3. Wire the drive or apply the minimum wiring for drive testing as described below.
- 4. Make sure you have on hand the following information about the drive components:
   rated mains supply voltage
  - motor type (motor data, if the motor type is not listed in the motor database)
  - feedback unit built into the motor (type, poles/lines/protocol)
  - moment of inertia of the load

#### 9.2.1.2 Minimum wiring for drive test without load, example



## 9.2.1.3 Confirm connections (example: directly to PC)

You can turn on logic power to the drive through the X10 connector (mains power voltage is not needed for communications).



Use WorkBench to configure the drive by using the service interface.

## 9.2.1.4 System integration

## MAC Address

The unique MAC address is pre-defined by the manufacturer (see nameplate).

## Service IP Address

The AKD2G service port X20 supports auto-IP, DHCP and static IP addressing. The drive is delivered with IP address 0.0.0.0. Depending on the connection (switch or PC) either DHCP or auto-IP mechanism assignes a unique IP address.

WorkBench uses the IP address to detect AKD2G devices in the LAN and start communication. With WorkBench you can set a static IP address for the drive (parameter *IP.ADDRESS*).

## EtherCAT Node Address

The EtherCAT node address is assigned automatically by the EtherCAT master.

## **CAN Node ID**

Set a CAN node ID for the drive in WorkBench (parameter CANBUS.NODEID).


## PROFINET

The station name and IP address must be set manually through the PROFINET master.

#### SafeID

Every module must have a unique SafeID in the safety system. Set the SafeID for every module with the two decimal rotary switches in the front.



Process to set the SafeID

- 1. Switch off 24V supply voltage.
- 2. Set S1 and S2 to a unique SafeID.
- 3. Switch on the 24V supply voltage.

The SafeID is calculated based on the rotary switches setting:

SafeID = 10 • S1 + S2

## Example

Rotary switches: S1 = 2, S2 =  $3 \rightarrow$  SafeID =  $10 \cdot 2 + 3 = 23$ 

Factory default setting

Rotary Switch setting S1 = 0, S2 = 1. Resulting SafeID is 1.

## 9.2.1.5 Install and start WorkBench

WorkBench is available from the DVD included with the drive. WorkBench is also available on the Kollmorgen Website: www.kollmorgen.com. Select the install file and follow the instructions given by the installer.

Once installation is complete, click the WorkBench icon to start the program.

#### 9.2.1.6 Setup the axis in WorkBench

Use the setup wizard and

- 1. Connect the axis,
- 2. Setup the axis and
- 3. Save parameter set to the drive.

Refer to the WorkBench Online Help for details.

## 9.2.1.7 Enable the axis (Hardware)

- 1. Switch 24 V to the STO inputs (X21/A11-B11 for axis 1 or X21/A12-B12 for axis 2)
- 2. Switch 24 V to the digital inputs for Hardware Enable Axis 1 (X21/A5) or 2 (X21/A6).

## 9.2.2 WorkBench Installation

#### 9.2.2.1 Use as directed

With the software to set up your drive you can alter and save the operating parameters for the AKD2G series of drives. The attached drive can be set up with the help of this software. During this procedure the drive can be controlled directly by the service functions.

Only professional personnel who have the relevant expertise ( $\rightarrow$  # 23) are permitted to carry out online parameter setting for a drive that is running.

Sets of data that have been stored on data media are not safe against unintended alteration by other persons. The use of unchecked data can result in unexpected movement. After loading a set of data always validate parameters which are relevant for the application before enabling the drive.

#### 9.2.2.2 Software description

Each drive must be configured according to the requirements of your machine. For most applications you can use a PC and WorkBench (the software to setup your drive) to set up the operating conditions and parameters for your drive.

An EtherNet cable connects the PC with the drive ( $\rightarrow$  # 122) WorkBench establishes the communication between PC and drive.

Please find the software to set up your drive on the accompanying DVD or in the download area of the Kollmorgen website.

With WorkBench you can

- easily change parameters and directly see what happens with your drive due to a continuous online connection to the drive,
- read important and actual values from the drive which are displayed on the PC (oscilloscope functions),
- save data sets on data media (archiving) and load them onto other drives or use them for backup and
- print data sets.

Most standard feedback systems are plug and play compatible. Motor nameplate data is stored in the feedback device and read by the drive automatically at startup. Non-plug and play Kollmorgen motors are stored in WorkBench and can be loaded with one-click using the Motor screen in the software.

An extensive online help with integrated description of all variables and functions supports you in each situation.

#### 9.2.2.3 Hardware requirements

The Service interface (X20, RJ45) of the drive is connected to the EtherNet interface of the PC by an EtherNet cable ( $\rightarrow$  # 122).





# 9.3 Switch-On and Switch-Off Behavior

This chapter describes the switch-on and switch-off behavior of the AKD2G with STO.

#### Behavior of "holding brake" function

Drives with an enabled holding brake function have a special timing for switching on and off the output stage ( $\rightarrow$  # 99). Events that remove the AXIS#.ACTIVE signal trigger the holding brake to apply. As with all electronic circuits, the general rule applies that there is a possibility of the internal holding brake module failing.

If the drive detects the motor to be at zero velocity (as configured by AXIS#.ZEROT and AXIS#.ZEROV) or timeout occurs during a stop procedure, the brake is applied. Set parameter AXIS#.MOTOR.BRAKEIMM to 1 with vertical axes, to apply the motor holding brake ( $\rightarrow$  # 99) immediately after faults or Hardware Disable.

#### Behavior when undervoltage condition is present

The behavior in an undervoltage condition depends on the VBUS.UVMODE setting.

VBUS.UVMODE	DC Bus Undervoltage Mode. Consult the WorkBench Online Help for configuring the parameter.
0	The drive will report a F2007 undervoltage fault any time an under- voltage condition occurs.
1 (default)	The drive will report a warning W2007 if not enabled. The drive will report a fault if the drive is enabled when the condition occurs, or an attempt is made to enable while an under voltage condition occurs.

#### **Functional Safety**


The drive can be braked down using SS1 and SDB and secured to standstill with SBC and STO. Even when power is being supplied, the drive shaft is protected against unintentional restart. The chapter "Functional Safety" describes how to use the safety functions ( $\rightarrow$  # 155).

- Functional Safety can be ensured with configured SBC (→ # 201) only.
- For SIL 3 a second (external) motor brake for an axis is required. For single axis drives this brake can be connected to X4 (→ # 101). For dual axis drives the additional brake must be controlled from another source (e.g. from the other axis or externally from a safety controller). The brakes can be mapped to an axis with WorkBench.
- The Hardware Enable does not initiate a controlled stop but switches off the power stage immediately.
- Set parameter AXIS#.MOTOR.BRAKEIMM to 1 with vertical axes, to apply the brake immediately after faults or Hardware Disable.

# 9.3.2 Switch-off behavior


NOTE

The drive's 24V supply must remain constant. STO disables the power stage immediately. Configured digital inputs and fieldbus commands can be used to perform controlled stops.

# 9.3.2.1 Switch-off behavior using the AXIS#.DIS command

The enable/disable button in WorkBench issues a *AXIS#.DIS* command internally to the drive. See *WorkBench Online Help*for configuring inputs and software commands. Sometimes this enable signal is called "Software Enable" (SW-Enable).

	AXIS#.DISMODE controls the behavior of the AXIS#.DIS command issued through WorkBench, or terminal, or fieldbus.
0	Disable axis immediately, if the drive detects the motor to be at zero velocity $AXIS#.ZEROV$ or timeout occurs brake is applied. Category 0 stop according to IEC 60204 ( $\rightarrow$ # 28).
2	Use controlled stop to disable drive, if the drive detects the motor to be at zero velocity $AXIS#.ZEROV$ or timeout occurs brake is applied. Category 1 stop according to IEC 60204 ( $\rightarrow$ # 28).




If the drive detects the motor to be at zero velocity (AXIS#.ZEROV) or timeout occurs (AXIS#.ZEROT), the motor brake is applied ( $\rightarrow$  # 99).

# 9.3.2.2 Switch-off behavior using a digital input (controlled stop)

This is a category 1 stop according to IEC 60204 ( $\rightarrow$  #28).


A digital input can be configured to bring the motor to a controlled stop and then disable the drive and apply the holding brake.(if present). See the *WorkBench Online Help* for information on configuring Digital Inputs.



If the drive detects the motor to be at zero velocity (AXIS#.ZEROV) or timeout occurs (AXIS#.ZEROT), the motor brake is applied ( $\rightarrow$  # 99).

# 9.3.2.3 Switch-off behavior using STO input (uncontrolled stop)

This is a category 0 stop according to IEC 60204 ( $\rightarrow$  #28). The STO input disables the power stage immediately.




If the drive detects the motor to be at zero velocity (AXIS#.ZEROV) or timeout occurs (AXIS#.ZEROT), the motor brake is applied ( $\rightarrow$  # 99). Set parameter AXIS#.MOTOR. BRAKEIMM to 1 with vertical axes, to apply the motor holding brake immediately after STO.

#### 9.3.2.4 Switch-off behavior in the event of a fault


The behavior of the drive always depends on the fault type and the setting of a number of different parameters (AXIS#.DISMODE, VBUS.UVFTHRESH, AXIS#.ZEROV, and others; see the *WorkBench Online Help* for more details). See the *Drive Fault and Warning Messages and Remedies* section of the *WorkBench User Manual* for a table describing the specific behavior of each fault. The next pages show examples for the possible fault behaviors. The fault relay output (DOUT9) switches the main contactor (Emergency Off circuit).

Switch-off behavior for faults that cause an immediate power stage disable



This is a category 0 stop according to IEC 60204 ( $\rightarrow$  #28).


If the drive detects the motor to be at zero velocity (AXIS#.ZEROV) or timeout occurs (AXIS#.ZEROT), the motor brake is applied ( $\rightarrow$  # 99). Set parameter AXIS#.MOTOR. BRAKEIMM to 1 with vertical axes, to apply the motor holding brake immediately after faults.



#### Switch-off behavior for faults that cause dynamic braking

This is a category 2 stop according to IEC 60204 ( $\rightarrow$  #28).

If the drive detects the motor to be at zero velocity (AXIS#.ZEROV) or timeout occurs (AXIS#.ZEROT), the motor brake is applied ( $\rightarrow$  # 99).



Switch-off behavior for faults that cause a controlled stop

This is a category 2 stop according to IEC 60204 ( $\rightarrow$  #28).

If the drive detects the motor to be at zero velocity (AXIS#.ZEROV) or timeout occurs (AXIS#.ZEROT), the motor brake is applied ( $\rightarrow$  # 99).

# 9.4 Fault and Warning Messages

# 9.4.1 Fault and warning messages AKD2G

A Fault is generally a notification of a critical system failure which will stop machine operation. Depending on the severity of the fault will depend on which system-stop mechanism is used.

A Warning is generally a notification to the user which is not critical and does not require the machine to immediately shut off.

Faults and Warnings follow the same pattern and are identified by a four digit code:


G G X X, where GG is a two digit group code, and XX is a two digit ID.

The display on the front panel of the drive shows the code of the fault or warning that occurred. Navigate with B1 / B2 to the Fault screen to see a short description of the fault or warning.

Example: single axis, Warning Axis 1

Example: dual axes, Fault Axis 2



You can retrieve faults on a per-axis basis with the parameter: AXIS#.FAULTS, where # is the Axis number. For retrieving warnings use AXIS#.WARNINGS, or DRV.WARNINGS.

Multiple faults may be present when a fault condition is occurring. Check the WorkBench Fault Screen or read the status of DRV.FAULTS and AXIS#.FAULTS for the entire list of faults.

DRV.FAULTS will return all faults across all axes, with the format #-GGXX where # is the axis number and GGXX is the four digit fault/warning code.

#### NOTICE

Eliminate errors and faults in compliance with work safety rules. Troubleshooting only by qualified and trained staff.



More information about fault messages, remedy and clearing faults can be found in the WorkBench User Manual.

# 9.5 Troubleshooting

Drive problems occur for a variety of reasons, depending on the conditions in your installation. The causes of faults in multi-axis systems can be especially complex. If you cannot resolve a fault or other issue using the troubleshooting guidance presented below, customer support can give you further assistance.

# 10.1 General notes

Resulting Functional Safety classification (SIL and/or PL level) is calculated across the drive system. The drive system usually consists of

- motion controller (e.g. AKC/KAS),
- safety controller (e.g. KSM),
- servo drives (AKD2G) and servo motors (e.g. AKM2G),
- motor brakes, feedback systems,
- cables to connect drive and motor,
- sensors/actors.

The safety properties listed in this chapter can be reached with Kollmorgen components.

#### NOTICE

The user must ensure the compliance of the application with all relevant directives and local electrical code. The user is responsible for implementation and validation of the drive system and safety system.

Only properly qualified personnel are permitted to perform such tasks as installation, setup and verification/validation.

- Mechanical installation: only by qualified personnel with mechanical expertise according to IEC 60417-6183.
- Electrical installation: only by qualified personnel with electrotechnical expertise according to IEC 60417-6182.
- Parameterizing Functional Safety: only by trained personnel with expertise appropriate to the complexity and safety integrity level of the drive system.
- Verification/Validation: only by trained personnel after any changes to the installation. The expertise of the personnel must be appropriate to the complexity and safety integrity level of the drive system.

**Safe State:** The safe state is always to remove the motor torque on all axes, to apply the brake(s), to deactivate all the safe digital outputs and to set the safe fieldbus connection to safe state (if applicable).

**Trigger conditions:** I/O failure and internal failure (such as problems detected on the drive or on the safety system itself) lead to safe state.



NOTE

# **CAUTION** High electrical voltage!

Risk of electrical shock! The safety functions do not provide an electrical separation from the power output. If manual access to the motor or drive power terminals is necessary,

- disconnect the drive from mains supply,
- consider the discharging time of the DC-Bus link,
- ensure the cabinet is safely disconnected and protected against unintended switch-on (for instance, with a lock-out and warning signs).

# 10.1.1 Use as directed

Safety functions are intended to reduce the risk of the machine operation to the required tolerable risk. To achieve functional safety, the wiring of the safety circuits must meet the safety requirements of IEC 60204, ISO 12100 and ISO 13849.

NOTICE

- The network, where the drive is connected to, must be secured according to state-ofthe-art information technology security requirements.
- The user IT specialists shall analyze whether further security requirements are applicable to ensure functional safety.
- The drive firmware can be updated. The parameter sets must be reloaded, verified and proof tested before normal operation is started.
- The SafeMotion Monitor (SMM) firmware can be updated by the user, see (→ # 159).
   For training and certification please contact Kollmorgen. The safety parameter set must be reloaded, verified and proof tested before normal operation is started.
- In certain types of machinery, two motors drive a single mechanical axis. It is the responsibility of the user to ensure that a fault reaction on the first motor-drive set is also carried out on the second motor-drive set and vice-versa. Safe I/O and/or a safe field bus such as FSoE can be used to achieve this.

# 10.1.2 Prohibited use

The safety functions must not be used if the drive is to be made inactive for Emergency-Off situations. In an Emergency-Off situation, the main relay is switched off (by the Emergency-Off button).

The device does not require maintenance. Opening the device voids the warranty. In case of damage or malfunction the drive must be sent for repair or must be replaced.

NOTICE

The drive may not be connected directly to the Internet. If the network, where the drive is connected to, is not secured according to state-of-the-art information technology, this could be a functional safety risk. The SafeMotion Monitor (SMM) does not fulfill requirements regarding the IEC 62443.

# Wiring

Wiring inside the specified enclosure (IP54) must meet the requirements of the standard IEC 60204-1 and ISO 13849-2 (Table D.4). Use copper wires, 0.5 mm<sup>2</sup> (20 awg), wire ferrules. Maximum distance for unshielded I/O lines is 3 m inside the cabinet. If the I/O cable leaves the cabinet, it must be EMC shielded.

Wiring outside the specified enclosure must be laid durably protected from outside damage (for example, by laying the cable in a duct, placed in different sheathed cables, or protected individually by grounding connection).

#### NOTICE

When wiring the digital inputs and outputs, take care, that short circuits between the inputs, the outputs or to a supply line are avoided.

# **10.2 Update the SMM Firmware**

Before updating the SMM firmware, please read the following information carefully:

#### NOTICE

- Replace certified SMM firmware only by another certified SMM firmware (see ( $\rightarrow$  # 154)).
- Changing the SMM firmware means changing the drive firmware, its ESI file and the WorkBench version. Only use a consistent firmware package. For information on compatibility see (→ # 154)).
- Only trained and qualified personnel shall update the SMM firmware.
- Safety parameters will be removed and need to be re-validated.

### To perform the update, you need:

- the Kollmorgen WorkBench with a safety project,
- the SMM firmware binary,
- the checksum of the new firmware,
- the update password.

# 10.3 Commissioning

# NOTICE

The safety features of the AKD2G only fulfill their purpose and can only function properly when the machine was developed according to ISO 12100, ISO 13849 and EN 62061. Depending on the use case further standards may apply.

The machine manufacturer is responsible for proper and safe commissioning. Violating the according standards can result in potential unsafe condition or dangerous behavior of the machine. Only properly qualified and trained personnel are permitted to perform the following tasks.

# 10.3.1 First time commissioning

Situation	Action

Suitable measures can be reviews, black-box tests, simulations and function tests. Make sure that only the required functions are configured.</li> <li>Make sure that the safety functions are executed as expected and that the configuration is suitable for the application. Suitable measures are function tests and fault injection tests (error condition tests).</li> <li>Validate the machine (→ # 265) Test the final product with all safety functions and in all operation modes and states. Validate that the safety functions in an undesired way. If used, check if all instances are assigned to the right use cases. Pay special attention to the correct use of safety function muting.</li> <li>Make sure that all safety functions and all possible situations are covered by the validation process.</li> <li>Document all actions and decisions according to the requirements of the standards (→ # 266).</li> </ul>

After commissioning	<ul> <li>Document and validate all information relevant to the end user in a suitable way. This includes capabilities and limits of the safety functions as well as maintenance instructions.</li> <li>Change default passwords and store them inaccessible to unqualified or unauthorized personnel. # 10.3.3 Diagnostic Testing of safe inputs, safe outputs and STO

Safe inputs require test pulses (OSSD,  $\rightarrow$  # 173) and there is no further requirement for diagnostic testing of the input wiring. There may however be additional diagnostic requirements for the device connected to the safe input.

STO is continuously diagnosed internally. There is no further requirement for diagnostic testing.

# 10.3.4 Diagnostic Testing of safe brake control

The BRAKE+ and BRAKE- emit test pulses ( $\rightarrow$  # 202)There is no further requirement for diagnostic testing of the brake wiring. Depending on the target SIL/PL, there is a periodic requirement to test the brake itself, see documentation on SBC (Safe Break Control) ( $\rightarrow$  # 201) and SBT (Safe Brake Test)( $\rightarrow$  # 210).

# 10.4 Safety Functions Option 3 (FSoE, SIL3 PLe)

The safety functions on the AKD2G with functional safety option 3 are certified.

**NOTICE** The drive is ready to operate with pre-configured STO function.

Each safety function can either be activated through FSoE or digital input or both. Configure the source of activation inside the safety parameters so it matches the system requirements.

Review the default setting and check if it matches the requirements. In case it does not match, adapt and validate the safety parameters.

For digital I/O commanding use WorkBench to map safety functions to safe I/Os.

With  $\underline{\mathsf{FSoE}}$  the safety functions can be activated with the safePLC of the FSoE Master.

With dual axis drives every safety function can be activated for one axis or for both axes (axis 1 or axis 2 or axes 1 and 2).

NOTE

The systematic safety integrity indicated by the systematic capability can be achieved only when the instructions and constraints are observed. Where violations occur, the claim for systematic capability is partially or wholly invalid.








Dual channel for axis1 and axis2, Safety Control with electronic outputs, automatic restart:


Dual channel for axis1 and axis2, Safety Control with relay contacts, automatic restart:

#### Dual channel for axis1 and axis2, Emergency Stop, manual restart:







The SMM is using moving average filters to compute both the velocity and the acceleration. This filtering impacts the response time of the safety functions using speed and/or acceleration and must be considered. When computing the response time, the length of the filter (Speed Computation Time Interval/Acceleration Computation Time Interval) must be added to the numbers of the tables above (t3). The size of these filters is configurable (see AXIS#.SAFEPARAM.SPEEDCOMPUTATIONINTERVAL and AXIS#.SAFEPARAM.ACCCOMPUTATIONINTERVAL).


#### 10.4.2.4 OSSD

#### Test pulses on safe digital inputs (SIN1 to SIN4)

NOTE

The used Safety Controller must be compatible to OSSD (Output Switching Signal Device) according to IEC 61496-1.

Safety controllers check their outputs periodically during the normal operation. Their selftest processes create pulses to the safe inputs of the drive.



#### NOTE


Test pulses with 150  $\mu$ s  $\leq$  T1  $\leq$  1 ms and T2  $\geq$  100 ms will not have any influence to the safety function. Test pulses, which are outside of this specification, will switch the safety function, but will not create a dangerous situation.

The SMM software enters the I/O Failure State (fault reaction time  $\leq 2ms$ )

- if no test pulse is detected for a period of 5 seconds,
- if three test pulses on different channels overlap three times in succession.

#### Test pulses on safe digital outputs (SOUT1 to SOUT4)

The safe digital outputs can be used as 24 V source voltage to be switched by an external safety relay to STO inputs.



NOTE

The output test pulses are compatible with the safe digital input requirements. There is only one test pulse on all four outputs at a time. They do not overlap each other. Be sure to use a force-guide relay, converter, or controller that does not respond to these test pulses.

AKD2G drives (connectivity option **E**) are connected as slaves to the EtherCAT® network by using RJ45 connectors X11 (out port) and X12 (in port).

NOTE

The FSoE safety architecture of the AKD2G is supported from TwinCAT 3 (Beckhoff). For use of an FSoE master from another manufacturer, contact our customer service.

The SMM implements an FSoE slave with a single endpoint per axis. The SMM implements the FSoE drive profile and supports fixed data structures for the safe fieldbus only. If configured the software inverts the error bit of the FSoE status word at the associated safe digital output. The output is off if the error bit is set.

The software of the SMM responds to FSoE Messages within 2 ms after receiving the messages by using the Safe Fieldbus Interface. Examples for response time calculation depending on the safety function combination see ( $\rightarrow$  # 169).

The SMM software receives this data in the parameter state of the FSoE Protocol:

- The checksum of the parameters and the drive type identification. In this case the software uses this checksum to validate the parameters received by using CoE.
- No parameter block or a zero checksum (without other parameter).
   In this case the software uses the parameters transmitted by using other means.

The required data to create the EtherCAT Slave Information file (ESI file) are provided, including the safety parameters for the transmission by using the safe fieldbus.

# FSoE telegram frame RxPDO

Size per frame per axis are 88 bits resulting in a total of 176 bits (22 bytes) for both axes. If an axis is not used, the data are transmitted anyway.

#### 10.4.2.6 Motor brake requirements

Zero, one or two brakes can be configured under safe brake control SBC ( $\rightarrow$  # 201). The brake must be a fail-safe brake with multiple springs. A fail-safe brake is applied when the 24V brake voltage is removed.

### Important notes

#### NOTICE

External brakes must allow operation at 100% duty cycle at 24V. In case of a failure the brake must be rated for the full current at full time.

Brakes are subject to wear. Wear increases by frequency and intensity of use. Avoid overloading the brakes by reducing motor speed with electrical braking before engaging the brakes when possible.

When a brake is used to reduce a risk (usage with SBC), it is part of a safety chain. As part of a safety chain, the brake must fulfill the requirements for functional safety depending on the target SIL or PLr.

The brake PFHd value shall not occupy more than 50% of the PFHd value of the whole safety chain. Keep in mind that the PFHd-value of a brake depends on frequency of usage. Kollmorgen brakes offer a B10d of >15,000,000 use cycles. For more information, refer to the respective *Motor Documentation*.

#### Example:

A use rate  $n_{op}$  of 2/h will result in a PFHd of 13.3 FIT. PFHd = 1 / [B10<sub>d</sub> / (0.1 \*  $n_{op}$ )] = 1 / [15 \* 10<sup>6</sup> / (0.1 \* 2/h)] = 13.3 FIT


#### HIPERFACE DSL – Initial safety setup

AKD2G SMM can use two safe encoders at the same time (one for each axis). For safety reasons, the safety system must ensure the encoder data are coming from the right physical encoder. This requires a link between the axis ID - where you intent to use the safe position - and the physical encoder by writing an encoder index to the encoder memory.

In consequence, when the encoder is new or the encoder has been used as a safe feedback with AKD2G but on another axis ID, you will encounter an I/O failure ("25 - encoder fault: invalid association") after the setup of the safe encoder in the safety parameters. This is an expected error. Acknowledge the I/O failure in order for the SMM to write the new encoder index in the encoder memory and start operating normally.

Proceed as follows:

 Use the I/O failure acknowledgement in order to create the link between the axis and the encoder. You can acknowledge I/O failure using FSoE (see FSoE control word) or you can use a safe input. If you use a safe input, it must be configured in your safety parameters:

# 10.4.6.7 Fault Reaction / Failure Messages

SS2 has a configurable fault reaction. STO is used by default but can be replaced by SS1 Instance 1. When the fault reaction is activated, the internal state (<u>AXIS#.SAFE.SS2</u><u>#.INTERNALSTATE</u>) is set to failed state (5).

SS2 Instance 1 can be configured as the fault reaction for other safety functions. Functions which support this feature are SSR, SDI, SLA, SAR, SLI, SLP and SLS.

# 10.4.7 SOS (Safe Operating Stop)

SOS description for drive option Functional Safety 3.

#### 10.4.7.1 Description

SOS monitors the position of the axis and ensures that it stays in a position window. The position of this window is defined when the monitoring starts. The upper and the lower limit of the position window are defined by the parameter s\_Zero\_SOS. If the position leaves the position window, the fault reaction STO will be activated.

Optionally, the velocity can be monitored to ensure that it stays in a window defined by the parameter n\_Zero\_SOS. The start of the position/velocity monitoring can be delayed by using the parameter t\_D\_SOS. This delay gives the axis the necessary time to stop.

SOS can be activated by a safe input and/or FSoE and/or the SS2 function. The SS2 function, when used, will detect whether the velocity is low enough to activate SOS by means of the parameter n\_Zero\_SOS. This is why it is important to set a correct value to n\_Zero\_ SOS. A value of 0 will most likely lead to a SS2 failure so that SS2 will activate its fault reaction.





# 10.4.8.1 Description

The safety function SBC (Safe Brake Control) is used for controlling the brakes wired to X1, X2 or X4 of the AKD2G. The connected brake is engaged and released by switching both lines (BR+ and BR-).

- The safety function SBC makes a motor with a motor brake suitable for the usage scenarios A1, A2, E1, E2, E3 according to DGUV.
- The safety function SBC makes a motor with a motor brake and a second brake on the same axis suitable for the usage scenarios A1, A2, A3, E1, E2, E3 according to DGUV.
- The brake can be configured with or without (SDB (Safe Dynamic Brake),  $\rightarrow$  # 216).
- For requirements to the motor brakes refer to (Motor brake requirements ,  $\rightarrow$  # 176).





#### 10.4.8.5 SBC Muting Function

# SBC muting is critical with regards to safety and has important influence on the safety level of an application. It has to be ensured that the use of SBC muting has no negative impact on the required safety level within the complete operational range of the application. The reliability has to be independent from the application. Consult your notified body for further information and approval.

For servicing purposes, manual control of the brakes may be necessary.

When SBC muting is active, the brakes can be overwritten even if STO/SBC is active. The SBC active signal will be suppressed and manual control via WorkBench, digital input or EtherCAT is possible.





# 10.4.8.10 Fault Reaction / Failure Messages

It is not possible to detect a malfunctioning brake through SBC. Therefore diagnosis with SBT is necessary in regular time intervals (see (SBT (Safe Brake Test),  $\rightarrow$  #210)).

A disconnected brake or an open circuit on the brake connectors (X1, X2 or X4) will result in an I/O failure causing SS1\_1 (fault reaction) to be triggered followed by STO.

An I/O failure warning is issued when the AKD2G is disabled.

A fault will be issued when the AKD2G is enabled and <u>AXIS#.SAFE.STO.REPORTFAULT</u> is set to 1.

# 10.4.9 SBT (Safe Brake Test)

Safe Brake Test description for drive option Functional Safety 2 or 3.

#### 10.4.9.1 Description

The function SBT (Safe Brake Test) can be used for testing the brakes connected to X1, X2 or X4 of the AKD2G. SBT is carried out by applying a configured torque against the closed brake and supervising the motion on the connected axis. The test is successful if the axis motion does not exceed a parameterized tolerance. If the axis motion exceeds the tolerance, the test is failed and therefore the safety functions using the brake are lost. After a failed brake test, safe brake operation cannot be assumed anymore. Brake replacement or service will be necessary.

- SBT is a diagnostic function for holding brakes. In order to operate brakes (SBC) that are part of a safety function (PLd / SIL2 or higher), frequent tests with SBT are required.
- SBT must be triggered regularly by the end customer.
- SBT considers the derating factor for brakes used in safety functions.
- During SBT, 130% of the max. possible application torque will be applied to the brake. Additional forces caused by vertical loads will be taken into account automatically.
- Brake slippage will be detected with a resolution of at least 1°.
- Two brakes can be assigned to one axis. Each brake can be configured with an independent slippage tolerance.
- SBT is only functional with SBC.
- SBT does not lead to wear of the brakes.

# Important Notes

#### NOTICE

- The user is responsible for the trigger of the SBT function.
- For correct operation of SBT the axis must be free to move when the drive releases the brake or releases both brakes as appropriate; if the machine has further motors and/or brakes mechanically coupled to the same axis, these devices must be set to states where they do not impede motion before SBT is carried out. In this case only one brake shall be tested at a time. Each brake must be tested independently.
- The machine manufacturer has to determine the SIL / PL reached by SBC + SBT according to the configuration and parameterization.

#### A brake test must be executed

- at least every 8 hours,
- at the start of a machine or at the transition to operation mode using the brake,
- after long standstill of the machine,
- after drive reboot,
- after brake service or replacement.

Depending on the target SIL / PL of the safety function that is performed by the brakes, it can be necessary to carry out SBT more often. In high safety demand applications (SIL3 / PLe, DC = high), it can be necessary to execute SBT every time prior to demand. For example if access to a dangerous area is prohibited by a safety interlock, SBT must be executed successfully before access can be granted.

# Restrictions

The maximum motion for the brake during safe brake test (see "Maximum Motion" parameters (Related Parameters,  $\rightarrow$  # 212)) cannot be set to a greater or equal value than 10800 arcminute. Otherwise, the SMM will return an error code once SBT function is started. The error code can be read by the keyword <u>AXIS#.SAFE.SBT.ERROR</u>, which will report "0x6 – SMM System Error".

In general, it is expected to set the maximum motion for the "tested" brake as small as possible to prevent any mechanical hazards when the brake loses its holding function. However, an application might need a larger tolerance window because of a mechanical gearing between encoder and motor shaft.

The maximum slippage velocity in [RPM] is calculated by:

(10800 [arcmin] - "Max. Motion" [arcmin]) \* 600 / 216

Example:

- For "Max. Motion" = 300 arcmin (5°), the max. slippage velocity is (10800-300) \* 600/216 = 29167 rpm.
- For "Max. Motion" = 7200 arcmin (120°), the max. slippage velocity is (10800-7200) \* 600/216 = 10000 rpm.

NOTE

The user has to consider for his application the worst case max. acceleration of motor shafts load including the additional "applied" test torque of the drive during SBT.

#### Preconditions for a brake test:

- The motor is at standstill.
- The tested brake is released.
- The drive is enabled.
- STO is not active.

#### **Encoder requirements**

NOTE

The encoder verification is not required for safe encoders that can be configured on drives with option FS3.

The SBT function can be executed with any encoder type. However, the encoder shall have at least a resolution and accuracy of 1 degree.

Encoder verification:

The user shall verify that the encoder works properly by his application. As example the following types of machine motion can be used to verify the function of the encoder:

- Perform a home move which includes a physical motion.
- A position move of at least 1 mechanical revolution of the encoder.
- A relative move to reach the start position of SBT.

After a long downtime of the machine, the encoder verification shall be repeated.

#### **Current measurement verification**

The verification check of drive current measurement should be done during machine commissioning and during re-commissioning due to changes such as replacement of the drive or firmware update.

The current measurement should verify expected current reported by the drive when holding a reference load. A small movement may be needed to overcome static friction.



# 10.4.10 SDB (Safe Dynamic Brake)

Safe Dynamic Brake description for drive option Functional Safety 2 or 3.

#### 10.4.10.1 Description

If the motor brake allows standstill braking only, dynamic braking is a method to slow down a servo system by dissipating the mechanical energy driven by the motor back EMF. When activated, the optional external Safe Dynamic Brake Module (SDB-Module) shorts the motor terminals. This forces all of the dynamic braking current to be stopping current. While the lines to the motor are shorted, the SDB status signal will be applied. When configured, SDB gets executed simultaneously along with STO.

Use this function when operating in Torque Mode and with high inertia loads.

Important Notes



# **WARNING** No Brake Power at and near standstill!

Serious injury could result when the load is not properly blocked. This function does not ensure functional safety.

- Add a safe mechanical blocking (for instance, a motor holding brake).
- Configure (SBC (Safe Brake Control),  $\rightarrow$  # 201) to be used with SDB.

#### NOTICE

- If SDB function is active, it is not possible to perform a controlled stop according to IEC 60204-1 category 1. If controlled stop category 1 is necessary, use the SS1 function.
- A failure in the SDB-Module can only be detected when changing states. In order to detect a loss of the safety function, SDB (STO) needs to be activated regularly according to the SIL/PL of the safety function.
- The SDB-Module is a safety related electromechanical component. The frequency of use contributes to its PFHd value and therefore to the whole safety chain.
- Activating the SDB-Module (0V, closing contacts) will result in a short circuit on the output stage which could impair the drive when enabled. Therefore pay close attention to the parameterized timings especially during restart. Keep in mind the mechanical reaction time of the SDB module for activation and deactivation.
- Brake power depends on the inertia and speed of the decelerated mass. Activating SDB when the motion contains high amounts of energy can result in a very fast stop or very high currents. The braking energy and therefore the braking speed can be limited by external resistors.
- For assistance with determining stopping time and braking current when using the SBD function of the AKD2G refer to the online <u>AKD2G Safe Dynamic Braking Tool</u> or contact Kollmorgen technical support.

# 10.5.1 Display, Push-Buttons and Rotary Switches

# Push buttons (B1, B2)

A short button press invokes the action corresponding to the symbol directly above the button. On the dashboard for example,

- a short press on B1 causes the menu system to appear, and
- a short press on B2 causes a help screen to appear.
- A long press (greater than 2 seconds) on B2 returns the display to the previous screen.

B1 / B2 Functions	Description
Boot from SD card	Push both buttons during power up to boot with data from SD card. Press the buttons first, then hold it down while turning on the 24V power supply.
Boot from flash fallback image	Remove the SD card, then press both buttons and hold them down while turning on the 24V power supply to boot from an on- board recovery image.
SafeID Validation	Push B2 to acknowledge SafeID validation request on the display.

# Rotary switches (S1, S2)

Two decimal coded rotary switches are used to set a unique SafeID for the drive. S1 sets the ten place, S2 sets the one place.

Process:

- 1. Switch off 24V supply voltage.
- 2. Set S1 and S2 to a unique SafeID.
- 3. Switch on the 24V supply voltage.

# **10.5.2 Default Safety Parameters**

#### Default device parameters

The AKD2G will be shipped to customer pre-programmed. The SafeID will be set to 1 and a set of parameters will be downloaded in the non-volatile memory of the SMM. The drive is ready to operate with pre-configured STO function. When these parameters are cleared or when the SafeID is changed, this parameter set is lost and cannot be retrieved.

#### WorkBench: default safety parameters

These are the parameters presented by default when adding a new safety device to a safety project. The SafeID is set to 1 by default. You can change these parameters. The default values correspond to the pre-programmed default device parameters.

#### FSoE parametrization: default parameters

Safety parameters can be downloaded through EtherCAT SDO ( $\rightarrow$  # 258) and then validated through FSoE using the SRA CRC (<u>AXISx.SAFE.FSOE.SRACRC</u>). By default, parameters will be downloaded with their default values found in the ESI file.

To use FSoE parametrization, clear the parameters from the non-volatile memory. The "FSoE parameters" are stored in the volatile memory only and they will be invalidated after a reboot or a restart of the FSoE stack.

# 10.5.3 SafeID

SS1 instance 1 and STO are the default fault reactions and cannot be deactivated.



You can easily configure the safety parameters with the KollmorgenWorkBench. The safety parameter configuration, download and validation are completely integrated.

WorkBench performs a consistency check which helps to identify contrary configurations. If the configuration passes the consistency check, WorkBench creates a safety parameter file. This file can be download to the drive through WorkBench or can be exported. Once the safety parameters are configured, downloaded and validated through WorkBench, the safety configuration will be persistent and no new configuration will be necessary after power cycle.





When safety parameter download to the AKD2G is selected, a validation and verification process starts. You are asked for a user name (1 to 8 characters) and a password (8 to 25 characters) to validate the package.

Default password is "SafeMotionMonitor**xyz**" ( "xyz" are the last three digits from the drive serial number, check serial numbers in the terminal with DRV.INFO, or name plate).



Click on "Download" to transmit the parameter package to the drive.

You have to make sure, that the intended, matching parameter package is loaded to the drive. To do this, first enter the SafeID (1) manually and then click on "Verify" (2).

The safety configuration will be persistent, no configuration required after power cycle.

## Download through EtherCAT FoE

The AKD2G drive supports the FoE ("File Access over EtherCAT") protocol. It is possible for the user to download a safety parameter file to the drive and validate the safety configuration just via EtherCAT access.

The following main steps describe the process:

- 1. Create and export the safety parameter file via WorkBench.
- **Note:** The exported file needs to be stored in the "i00" format.
- 2. Download the safety parameter file via FoE.
- 3. Validate the safe configuration via CoE ("CANopen over EtherCAT") and SDO access.

The details for these main steps are written here:

#### Step 1: Export

See (WorkBench Safety Function Setup,  $\rightarrow$  #250) for setting up the safety parameter for WorkBench. Once the safety configuration is done and the safety package has been created, the file can be exported.

The following example shows the screen that must be used to export the file. Select the "Export" button on the righthand side:

The file can now be used in the EtherCAT master for FoE download.

### Step 2: Download

Before downloading the safety parameter file to the drive, the EtherCAT master must set the drive to the EtherCAT communication state "Boot". Then the safety parameter file can be transferred to the drive. The specific password for the FoE protocol is not needed for this.

The download of a corrupted or not compatible safety parameter file will generate an FoE error message ("Failed loading file to flash"). The SMM will stay in state 3 – "Configuration required".

### Step 3: Validation

The validation of the file needs to be done through SDO access.

NOTE

- The state of the SMM (Index: 0x37C1, Subindex: 0x00) will transition from 3 "Configuration required" to 5 – "Parameter validation required" after a successful download of the safety parameter file. To perform the validation, the state of the SMM must be 5 – "Parameter validation required". If not, the validation will be rejected by the system.
  - When the used SafeID is 1 and the drive still has its default parameter values, you have to delete those to get to SMM state 3. To do so, change the SafeID, power cycle the drive, reset the SafeID and power cycle the drive again.

To validate the downloaded safety parameters, write the following EtherCAT CoE objects in this order:

If the validation process is successful, the SDO access will create no abort message and the SMM will transition to state 6 – "Operational".

If the validation process fails (most likely due to wrong or non-conform entry), the safety configuration will NOT be activated, the SMM will stay in state 5 – "Parameter Validation required" and the SDO write will create an abort message. If the process fails, refer to "Troubleshooting Functional Safety" ( $\rightarrow$  # 269)

The safety configuration is retained even after power cycling.

### Download through EtherCAT FSoE

The safety parameters file created with WorkBench can be downloaded through safe Ether-CAT using FSoE (Fail Safe over EtherCAT).

Usually, the FSoE master also supports SRA - "Safety related-application" parameters download. Then the safety configuration can be also sent to the drive using EtherCAT SDO access and FSoE. All safety parameters are available in the object dictionary and can be written individually using EtherCAT SDO. However, not all parameters have to be written. If a parameter is not written, then the default value (specified in the ESI file) is assumed.

The validation **must** be done through the FSoE master, which sends the SRA CRC to the AKD2G FSoE slaves during startup. This validation step can only be successful if the SMM was in state 3 – "Configuration required" prior to the validation process. If the drive has


already a persistent safety configuration, this must be cleared to set the SMM state to 3 - "Configuration required" (see (Settings ,  $\rightarrow$  # 247).

If the validation is successful, the SMM state will transition to state 6 – "Operational". Otherwise, the SMM will stay in state 3 – "Configuration required".

The safety configuration is non-persistent. The configuration will be cleared after a reboot or a reset of the FSoE connection.

## 10.5.6.4 Safety Configuration Diagram

A safety configuration status diagram pops up when you click on the safety indicator in the status bar.



The configured safety functions are visible as well as the current safe I/O state.

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## 10.5.7 Parameterization of User Units

Position, velocity and acceleration values are computed and stored in increments (also known as counts) in the SMM. To make these values understandable in the parameterization and in the different diagnostic elements, they are presented in user units. The conversion is done in 2 steps:

- Increments <=> Encoder Unit
- Encoder Unit <=> User Unit

The advantage of having this 2 steps conversion is that you do not have to calculate the ratio by yourself, you just enter the encoder specification and the conversion from a known unit to the unit you want.

### **Rotary example**

Usually, rotary encoders will be defined by the number of increments per revolution. The user unit could be defined by something in relation to 1 revolution, for example degrees.

- 2048 increments <=> 1 rev
- 1 rev <=> 360 degrees

### Linear example

Usually, linear encoders are defined by the distance between each increment. The user unit could be any factor of this distance, for example µm.

- 1 increment nm <=> 10 nm
- 1000 nm <=> 1 μm

The ratio conversion could be specified independently for position, velocity and acceleration. There is a set of distinct ratios for each axis.

### 10.5.7.1 Encoder Settings

To configure this ratio, you need to select an encoder type, the SMM will do all the computing using internal data. Encoder setup ( $\rightarrow$  # 177).

The intervals define a filter on the positions read to compute the velocity and the acceleration. These parameters have an influence on the response time of the computed velocity and acceleration. The bigger these values ares, the bigger the lag will be.

### 10.5.7.2 Encoder Unit <=> User Unit

To configure this ratio, the user must define 4 parameters for each unit type. 2 of the 4 parameters are used for the ratio computing and the 2 are defined to improve usability but not used in the computation.

The computation ratio needs to be defined by:

- Number of increment for the value (pos/vel/acc) in encoder unit
- Number of increment for the value (pos/vel/acc) in user unit

For example:

- 1 [rev] / 1 [rev/s] / 1 [rev/s^2]
- 360 [deg] / 60 [RPM] / 60 [RPM/s]

SMM supports integer values only, no floating point. If you want to have one decimal, you need to compute your ratio accordingly and use a 'deci' factor on the unit, and similarly for more decimals (cent, milli, ...).

These computations are not safe – the ratio has to be calculated and verified by the user, WorkBench shows these values for convenience only.

- Encoder: describes the Increments <=> Encoder Unit conversion ratio.
- Pos/Vel/Acc : describes the Encoder Unit <=> User Unit conversion ratio.
- Resolution : indicates what is the minimum resolution for 1 count (for example: 0.027 ddeg, respectively 0.0027 degree).

# 10.6 Validation

NOTE

Validation is done on transferred parameters using CRC check. Parameters transferred with FSoE (when FSoE parametrization is used) do not require user validation. More information referring to parameter download ( $\rightarrow$  # 257).

## 10.6.1 Validation of SafeID

If the SafeID is not flagged as validated when booting, you will get the message: "SafeID not validated" . Then do the following:

- 1. Compare the displayed SafeID with the paperwork.
- 2. If the SafeID is correct, press button B2 twice within 10 seconds to validate. If you do not press B2, the drive remains in the safe state.

Validation of the SafeID is performed through FSoE

- If FSoE parameterization is used and
- If the SafeID is not validated yet and
- if the SafeID matched the safe address defined in the safe PLC.

### **10.6.2 Validation of Safety Parameters**

The parameter CRC is equal to the system CRC. The character string of the SafeID is concatenated with the character string of the CRC.

The purpose of validation is to ensure that all safety parameters as a group are suitable for the application.

Example for invalid parameters: The parameters are valid for an elevator drive, but they are not for a paper machine drive.

The person responsible for validation must document decisions. Therefore the safety related system stores information about the user (user name, date of validation).

- The user checks the System CRC. This value is read from the drive (see parameter value <u>SAFE.CRC</u>). This may require the user to sign a document about the correct parameters having been entered.
- The user must check if all drives have been programmed correctly.

## 10.6.3 Validation of Safe I/O Installation

The person conducting the validation must be independent of the Safety Function Design. See ISO 13849-2:2012, 4.1 Validation principles.

# 10.6.4 Validation Report

To assist commissioning and documentation, WorkBench offers to print a "Safe Motion Validation Report" suiting the safety parameter configuration. Select the corresponding safety parameter package (1). To view the validation report, click on "View" (2) directly or "View Validation Report" (3).

## 10.7 Operation

NOTICE

After the initial commissioning and validation, it must be ensured the initial state is permanently retained. Modification of any kind is prohibited without a proper modification process.

In case of a fault reaction occurring (STO-, SS1- or SS2-Active without being activated on purpose) the drive should not be restarted before:

- the cause of the fault reaction is investigated and found;
- the reason of the fault reaction is removed/resolved;
- safe operation of the application is ensured.

Every occurring incident must be documented.

If the investigation of the fault reaction results in the discovery of a potential hazard or risk the application shall not return to normal operation before proper risk reduction is achieved.

In order to maintain functional safety, safety chains containing elements that cannot be tested regularly or without activation during normal operation, need to be periodically tested at least:

- once per year for SIL 2, PL d / Cat. 3;
- once every three months for SIL 3, PL e / Cat. 3;
- once every day for SIL 3, PL e / Cat. 4.

See IEC 61800-5-2 and ISO 13849 for further information.

In addition, tests for brakes need to be carried out independently (SBT (Safe Brake Test),  $\rightarrow$  # 210).

The drive itself does not require any maintenance (Maintenance and cleaning,  $\rightarrow$  # 32).

Replacement is only necessary in case of a defect or if the max. service life of the device (Mission Time, TM) is exceeded (Field Replacement,  $\rightarrow$  # 268).

Wear parts of safety chains such as relays, brakes or SDB modules, need to be swapped at the end of their lifetime as well as damaged or defect auxiliary equipment.

The replacement of any parts of the safety chain does not allow any changes or modifications to the safety characteristics or functionality of a safety chain. A new validation of the safety functions is necessary after working on any safety related equipment. In case of a modification a risk reevaluation and modification process needs to be carried out before retuning the drive to normal operation.

Every maintenance activity must be documented.

Periodic audits have to be carried out and documented in order to ensure the functional safety of the machine. Check the drives information display for faults and warnings regularly.

# 10.7.1 Operation States

The status bar in WorkBench offers a brief overview of the safety operation status.

Safety bar indicator	Status
STO Safety	No safety limitations (safety functions) are selected or active. The axis is in operational mode.
STO Safety	The axis is not in an operational state. A warning that is not safety related prevents operation.
STO Safety (X)	The axis is not in an operational state. An error that is not safety related prevents operation.
STO Safety	Safety limitations (safety functions) are active, such as SS1 or SOS. Safe operation is active!
STO Safety	A safety function activated STO. Either STO was activated manu- ally or a fault reaction occurred.
STO Safety A	Drive is in safe state and not operational. An internal failure or and I/O failure occurred.

Clicking on the safety symbol will open a pop-up window containing more detailed information on the safety configuration and status ( $\rightarrow$  # 261). The view give information about which function(s) are or were activated, and which caused a fault reaction.

### 10.7.2 Field Replacement

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NOTICE
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Field replacement must be performed by a trained and qualified personnel. After the drive is replaced and re-configured, the drive must be verified and proof tested before normal operation is started.

### The replacement drive must

- match the specification of the replaced drive in term of voltage, features and safety option, see "Part Number Scheme" (→ # 36),
- contain firmwares with same versions, particularly for the SMM. If not, a firmware upgrade or downgrade must be performed, see (Update the SMM Firmware, → # 159),
- have invalidated safety parameters.


### Reconfiguring the replacement drive:

- Other drives of the same safety group or of the same machine should not be impacted by this process.
- Before power on, the replacement drive SafeID must match the one of the replaced drive. Change the rotary switches accordingly.
- Validate the new SafeID if needed during the boot of the drive, see "Validation" (→ # 265).
- **Important:** Configure and validate the SafeID before downloading new parameters.
- Download safety parameters on the replacement drive. SafeID value is used to choose the right set of parameters for this drive (see "Safety Parameter Download" (→ # 257)).
   Depending on your application, this could be:
  - using WorkBench. Use the project of your safety application to download the parameters,
  - using non-safe field bus,
  - using FSoE.
- Validate that the correct parameters have been downloaded by comparing the CRC, see "Validation of Safety Parameters (→ # 265)


# 10.8 Safety Faults, Safety Warnings

# 10.8.1 LCD Display

The drive offers an LCD display and two push-buttons, B1 and B2, for navigation.



The display on the front panel of the drive shows the code of the fault or warning that occurred. Safety Faults and Warnings follow the same pattern and are identified by a four digit code 90 XX, where 90 is the two digit group code, and XX is a two digit ID. Navigate with B1 / B2 to the Fault screen to see a short description of the fault or warning. See WorkBench Onlinehelp for details.

# **10.8.2 Failure Categories**

AKD2G with SMM (safety option 2 or 3) have the following safety circuit fault states:

Failu	re category	Description	Reaction
1	I/O Failure	A problem is detected around the drive. Example: encoder problem, missing OSSD test pulses or a wiring issue. Resolving: by the user or by using FSoE Restart: acknowledge fault, power off/on, normal operation can be resumed.

NOTE

An internal failure occurs, when a problem in the internal SMM is detected. Therefore, deceleration, applying the brakes and switching off the output may not be possible under all circumstances.

Safety Faults and Safety Warnings cannot be muted or suspended.

Stuck at faults on the STO output, the digital outputs or the brake output show up as I/O failures or internal failures. Power supply faults (over and under voltage) show up as internal or fatal failure. Many diagnostic errors are false positives.

The fault tolerance time for each diagnostic measure (diagnostic test interval) is maximum  $T_2 = 1$  h.

# 10.8.3 SMM Failure Classification and Behavior

The parameter <u>SAFE.ERROR</u> gives the current error code of the SMM, accessible through CoE. <u>SAFE.ERRORINSTANCE</u> indicates the current instance of the error code.

The SMM send the failure ID to the drive, if possible. The drive creates faults and warnings listed in the next chapter.
